#### SITUATION ASSESSMENT

The fire has currently burned 9,217 acres with 60% containment and not expanding at this time. There are 1,455 personnel committed. Three firefighters with minor injuries. 23 structures destroyed, 36 structures damaged (homes and out buildings). Fire suppression efforts continue with full containment expected on 10/14/17. Damage inspections are ongoing. Unified Command partners Anaheim, Orange, OCFA, Cal Fire and USFS with a Type 3 Incident Management Team assigned. Incident Command Post is at the Great Park in Irvine. The cause of the fire remains under investigation.

### SITUATION SUMMARY REPORT

#### WEATHER SUMMARY

A trough of low pressure will continue to dominate the weather pattern today with morning low clouds from the coast to the valleys. The trough will pull away Friday with gradually warming temps and lowering humidity west of the mountains. Temps will heat up and humidity will plummet west of the mountains Saturday through Sunday as offshore northeast winds develop. Winds will become gusty through and below the Cajon Pass and the western San Geronio Pass and along the coastal facing slopes of the Santa Ana Mountains and foothills. Gusts of 30 to 40 mph is forecast. Localized gusts of 50+ mph is likely at wind-prone locales such as Freemont Canyon in Orange County.

#### TODAY

Sky/weather.....Cloudy...becoming mostly sunny

Max temperature.....72 - 78

Min humidity.....45 - 55 percent

WIND (20 FT).....Variable 2 - 4 mph becoming west around 6 mph in the afternoon

#### TONIGHT

Sky/weather.....Mostly clear. Patchy fog after midnight

Min temperature.....53 - 59

Max humidity.....80 - 90 percent
